From the Manse

We are gradually and carefully opening our church building. We have been having Sunday morning services (Early Church and 10.30 service) every week since September and kept the Zoom service for our Sunday evening services. We are about to reopen our fellowship meeting after the service with refreshment as we offer a breakfast this Sunday for the Harvest service. We are also preparing the weekday service and activities (perhaps including the Tuesday service) as well.

It seems that we are fully back to 'normal' and the Harvest Service this Sunday will be the celebration of the re-opening our services and fellowship as well as thanks for the harvest. It will be wonderful to spent time together as we have waited for it for a long time.

However, we still have to be careful about the situation we are in. We still have to care for our vulnerable members because the threat of Covid has not been removed completely. Going back to our mission in and outside of the church cannot just happen by opening the church building. We need manpower more than ever. We have lack of stewards, helpers for catering, serving refreshments, helping Messy Church, Early Church, in all parts of our church.

Covid Update

As Autumn begins and more people are considering whether or not to return to Church services at Trinity, we thought it would be a good time to set out our current plans for dealing with continuing levels of Covid 19 infection within the community. There are some things that we shall be continuing to do: Encouraging continued wearing of masks while on the premises, particularly when singing

- Encouraging hand sanitising on arrival at Church
- Receiving the collection in receptacles in the anteroom, rather than passing round a collection bag
- Not handing out hymn books, Bibles etc but using the screen and encouraging the congregation to bring their own books
- Organising Communion Services so that there is no

congregating at the altar

• Asking stewards to wipe down surfaces that have been used after each service.

There are also some things which we shall no longer be doing:

- Taking names of those attending services
- Having a one-way system to arrive and depart from services. The front and back doors will be available for entry and the lift will be switched on.

We shall be returning to serving refreshments when there are volunteers available to prepare them. The first occasion will be on 3 October when breakfast will be available before the service. We have volunteers to help with this breakfast but we do not yet have volunteers to prepare refreshments for other services. If you are willing to offer to help in future please let a member of the Leadership Team know.

Anticipating Christmas

The first Sunday in Advent, 28 November, is a Local Arrangement for the 10.30am service and I am hoping to arrange a service in which the congregation plays an active part. As we all missed out on our Advent and Christmas services and singing carols and advent hymns together, I am hoping, with your help, to be able to put together a service of celebration for the Advent and Christmas period. This will include your poems, readings, prayers, hymns and carols together with other music, or pictures, anything that speaks to you of the wonder, awe and love of the Christmas period. Public Issues (from Charles Horsefield & 'Cilla Wagner)

This is a busy week for Public Issues both nationally and locally. Last Sunday there was a South Beds Circuit service at which a racial justice strategy was adopted, based on a project led by Rev Arlington Trotman. Then on Monday 27 September LL Town Council recognised a Climate Emergency and set targets for reducing carbon emissions, which should impact on all our lives to some extent. On Saturday 2nd October there is a meeting at Trinity, to be attended by The Mayor, to celebrate Black History month. And on Sunday 3rd October at our own Harvest Festival we will be collecting food and other items that will go to the LL Community Foodbank at the Black Horse. Those who volunteer at the Black Horse are often reminded of the poverty that is still growing in the town by the gratitude expressed by recipients of food bags, all of whom have been referred to the charity by relevant agencies. A video made at The Black Horse at the end of the Covid Lock Down is to be shown at our next Church Council Meeting.

Whilst all these important issues are being addressed, Cilla has been looking on our behalf at what we can all do at home to make things a bit better. She has focussed this week on the issue of water. The charity Water Aid tell us that one in ten people in the world still don't have clean water and the effects of climate change are making things worse. Their recent report makes us aware of how fortunate we are to have access to clean water at home and how we shouldn't waste it or take it for granted.

In our gardens - do we have water butts or other containers to collect rainwater? Do we collect the cold water that we run off before filling a washing-up bowl, for use in the garden and do we use the washing-up water afterwards? It won't do any harm. Do we remember that there is no need to water the leaves of plants, only the earth around the roots? And that one good soak late-on is more effective than several splashes throughout the day. Standing plant pots on saucers during summer retains excess water and larger pots are less likely to dry out than small ones, especially if the soil surface is covered with grit or small pebbles to retain moisture.
