Methodist Way of Life Course

Angela Brydon, District Discipleship Enabler is running some further sessions on the Methodist Way of Life.

Public Issues (from Charles Horsefield & Cilla Wagner)

This week I have not needed to look around for a subject to write about. With COP 26 in full spate Climate Change is hard to ignore. But the question on my mind is, What can I do to help? On Sunday Ivor Michelmore focussed on the issue in his prayers of intercession and I hope we are all doing that regularly. But we heard it said last week that "recycling is a red herring" and I imagine that the same could be said about most of the environmentally-sensitive things we might do at home. Some seem to think that major changes to what the country manufactures, what we drive around in and how we generate our energy are the only things that will get us to carbon neutrality by 2050. But will the momentum of these massive projects be maintained for the next 30 years if those of us who are not directly involved just get on with our lives as if we are not concerned? I think we all need to get involved in any way we feel able, do whatever we can along the lines suggested by Cilla below and pray that our leaders will deliver what they are promising at COP 26.

Cilla reminds us that whilst bread is a vital part of our daily diet it is thrown away on an alarmingly large scale. I appears that about 20 million slices are thrown away every day and if this was stopped it could do the same for greenhouse gas emissions as planting 5.3 million trees. Wasting excess bread seems so unnecessary as it can easily be stored in a freezer and later used to make bread and butter pudding. Or turned into breadcrumbs for adding to meatballs or burgers. You may well have many other ways of using up excess bread.

Thinking the way that Cilla suggests will keep us all involved in the battle against global warning and if everyone thinks this way, we can actually make a difference. There is no Planet B.

1. Opening devotions: the Chairman led a meditation on 1 Corinthians 13: 1-7, showing how 'love' could be replaced by 'Jesus' throughout the passage and noting how the love received by us from God should guide us to love others and tell them of the love of God.

2. Apologies: Richard Bates, Sue Horsefield, Chris Lowe, Marilyn Powell.

3. Membership of the meeting: the list was agreed to be correct.

4. Identification of any conflict of interest: none.

5. Pastoral concerns & courtesies: since the last meeting, we were sad to record the deaths of Mavis Edes, Alan Curtis and Godfrey Williams (recently moved to Leighton Buzzard with his wife, Wendy). Laurie Renfrew is in Harefield hospital, awaiting a heart operation. Anne Hodgskiss & Pat Kight have both moved away. Thanks were expressed to all Pastoral Friends and Links for their continued support.

6. Minutes of last meeting: accepted.

7. Matters arising: none.

8. Notice of AOB: none.

9. Appointments: the appointments of Sheila Pollard as Treasurer and Varuna Perera as book keeper were proposed by Ann Guy, seconded by David Dawes and agreed by the meeting. Thanks were expressed to David Dawes for his work as Treasurer for the last two, difficult years. Nominations of David Dawes, Roger Owers and Alison Stokes as church representatives to Church Council were proposed by Anne Gray, seconded by Ann Guy and agreed by the meeting.

10. Vacancies: a letter from Merle Tungay, retiring from her role as Flower Circle Secretary and Treasurer after 34 years was read out. Grateful thanks for her faithful service were expressed. 2 vacancies are outstanding for Church representatives to Church Council.

11. Life and Mission of the Church – Reports from:

A. Leadership Team (Anne Gray): see report. Weekly face to face services re-started on 5th September, thanks in no small part to the work of Alison Arnold, who chairs the Covid Group. Rev Seung -Wook Jung was unanimously re-appointed at the Circuit meeting for a further 5 years from 2022-2027. Thanks to David Dawes who has been the Treasurer for the last two years. It was agreed that retiring collections for Charities of the Month should resume. It was also agreed that the Leadership Team should go ahead with looking into purchasing a tea trolley for use in the anteroom, using the gift in memory of Diane Keats. The proposal that consideration of a Thursday Fellowship being held in the Hall was given the go-ahead. The proposal that joint services of the Early Church and 10:30 congregations be held on the 5th Sunday of each month was agreed, as a trial for one year. Concern was raised that these services would disrupt the recently established pattern of weekly Early Church services. It was agreed that there should be no services on Sunday, 26th December (Boxing Day).

B. Finance (David Dawes): see report. David thanked Roger Owers and Sheila Pollard for their support during his time as Treasurer. Over the Covid lockdowns, income from lettings had gone down, but it has now started to improve, though not back to previous levels. David proposed that the accounts be accepted, subject to the approval of the Independent Examiner, seconded by Sheila Pollard and agreed by the meeting. **C. Resources (Sheila Pollard):** following research by David Dawes, it had been suggested that we change our bank from HSBC to the Co-op. Sheila sought approval to proceed with these arrangements as soon as possible, seconded by Ann Guy and agreed by the meeting. The Resources Committee had explained their suggested response to the Connexion's request that all churches should donate 15% of their balances to the Connexion's Fund Reserve. The committee's recommended response of 15% of the General Fund excess over our Reserves limit (£240) was proposed by David Dawes, seconded by Kathy Keeley and agreed by the meeting.

D. Policies (Sheila Pollard): acceptance of the Reserves Policy was proposed by Sheila Pollard, seconded by Anne Gray and agreed by the meeting. The proposed minor changes on the other policies which required updating were agreed.

E. Property Committee (Tim Hitchcock): see report. Our energy supplier has recently ceased trading.. It had been suggested that we use Scottish Power instead, but they have said they will not supply us, so a deal with British Gas is being pursued. Proposed by Tim Hitchcock, seconded by David Dawes, agreed by the meeting. Approval to sign off the Annual Return was proposed by Tony. Oldroyd and seconded by Sheila Pollard. Agreed.

F. Worship Planning Meeting (Peter Baker, Rev Seung-Wook Jung): see report. It was agreed that there is no need in future for this group to submit reports to Church Council meetings, as its thoughts are conveyed to the Leadership Team for consideration and implementation.

G. Pastoral Oversight (Sue Horsefield, Patience Owers): see report. There is still a shortage of volunteers to be Pastoral Friends.

H. Public Issues & Social Action (Richard Bates, Charles Horsefield): see report. The town's Black History event was held at Trinity on 2nd October. A 'thank you' poster has been received from the. Leighton Linslade Homeless Service in response to our donation of Harvest Festival gifts. I. Messy Church (Tasha Williams): see report.

J. Safeguarding (Ann Guy): see report

K. Health & Safety (Alison Arnold): no report.

L. Churches Together (Kathy Keeley): Chris Lowe has been appointed Secretary of Leighton Linslade Churches Together.

12. Trustee Duties: (Sheila Pollard): Sheila went through a summary of the Charity Commission's guidance for trustees of a charity. She concluded with thanks to all the people involved in trying to fulfil the many responsibilities this incurs.

13. Circuit Matters (Jackie Roberts): the Circuit has welcomed its new Superintendent Minister, Rev Patrick Kandeh. 3. New Circuit Stewards have been appointed, one being Roger Owers. A decision was made at Conference regarding the closure of churches, that there should be at least 12 members, rather than
6. This could have repercussions. For 2 of the Circuit's churches.
14. Date of next Church Council: Wednesday 9th. February, 2022 at 19:30. Seung-Wook proposed this be a Zoom meeting, considering the likely inclement, dark weather, seconded by Catherine Roots and agreed by the meeting.

Date of ACM: Sunday, 15th May, 2022 after the 10:30 service (moved from 8th May)
