Public Issues (from Charles Horsefield & Cilla Wagner)

As we move into the "Season of Goodwill" there are many other Public Issues of concern but it would feel a bit premature to abandon the big one - Climate Change - so soon after COP 26. Especially since the President and Vice-President of the Methodist Conference have signed a statement aimed at world leaders, calling for..." further actions that respond meaningfully to the magnitude of the emergency we face." Fortunately, Cilla has again answered the question as to what we who are not politicians, international financiers or major industrialists can actually do about Climate Change - apart from worrying, praying and persuading. Worrying won't help of course; praying and persuading might, but implementing the measures we can actually take in our own lives, including recycling, certainly will. And she has given me a seasonal angle on recycling in her contribution this time. If we all implement these small measures, together we will achieve a significant impact.

Cilla reminds us that whilst most shops and businesses are frantically encouraging us to buy Christmas presents, one well-known toy shop, "The Entertainer", have re-launched their "Toy Re-homing Scheme". They are appealing for old, unwanted toys (including games and books) which will be recycled and given to poorer children in the UK with the help of The Salvation Army. There are branches of The Entertainer in Friars Square, Aylesbury as well as in Hemel Hempstead and Luton. If you are unable to get your family's unwanted toys directly to these shops, Phil and Cilla will be pleased to take them on your behalf, as will I. I am planning to suggest to my grandchildren that if some of their old toys are collected up and passed on, Santa will have a clearer path to deliver some more to them on Christmas Eve. And toys destined for the waste bin will have a new lease of life with their new, grateful, owners.
