Public Issues (from Charles Horsefield & Cilla Wagner)

As usual our two contributions to this article are looking through different ends of a telescope. Cilla has some good news about practical things we can actually do something about but I'm going to begin with something I just heard on the radio. It seems the World Health Organisation (the employers of Dr Who?) have been reminding leaders of rich, developed countries like ours that poorer countries are nowhere near completing their first round of Covid jabs, Whilst we in the West are considering a fourth round and the price of vaccine is soaring. Allowing the virus to rage in poor countries is not just callous and contrary to the commandment to love our neighbours as ourselves, it is also short -sighted. Because it could result in waves of new variants that will reach us eventually. As with so many of these high level issues we feel powerless to act but that is not actually the case. Whilst there

is no point in worrying about things beyond our control, we can talk about them and pray about them. Everything and everyone is interconnected in some way and even the smallest of waves can spread a long way - towards as well away from us.

But what about the good news? It is encouraging to learn from Cilla that more recycling opportunities have been made available in the Tesco car park. A large container has been provided to take empty bread bags, crisp and biscuit packets, pet pouches, cling film, sweet and chocolate wrappers. In addition Tesco and Superdrug, in cooperation with Maybelline Cosmetics, have provided a large box in which empty cosmetic and skin care containers such as lipsticks, tubes, pallets and plastic jars can be deposited for recycling. No glass containers though - these can go in the bottle bank in the corner of the car park. Best wishes for a Happy New Year of recycling in every way we can, from Charles and Cilla.
