From the Manse

The year 2025 has begun, but it feels far from a bright and hopeful start. With floods, wildfires, wars, extreme climate changes, and the loss of two church members, it's easy to wonder where hope can be found. Reflecting on these challenges led me to revisit the story of Jesus' birth from the past Christmas season.

At the time of Jesus' birth, Israel was under Roman rule, facing significant political, social, and religious challenges. Roman taxation imposed a heavy burden on the people, leading to widespread poverty and unrest. Society was deeply divided, with a small elite controlling most of the wealth, while the majority lived as farmers, labourers, or artisans struggling for daily survival.

Amid this bleak reality, God's messenger did not turn to Israel's leaders, revolutionaries, or renowned rabbis. Instead, the angel sought out a young teenage girl from the small town of Bethlehem, who was preparing for marriage. To her, God entrusted the message of hope—not just for Israel but for all humanity. Her response, "I am the Lord's servant, may your word to me be fulfilled," became the pathway through which the light of God's hope entered the world.

This story reminds us that hope does not stem from external circumstances or human solutions. True hope is rooted in God's promises and presence. Just as God chose to shine His light through someone humble and ordinary, He continues to call us to be bearers of His light and hope in a dark and troubled world.

Prayer stars

Thank you to all those who helped set up and take down the Christmas decorations. I think we can all agree that the church looked very festive. None of this could be done without your help.

The Christmas tree has been removed from the front window and you may have noticed some odd looking stars in its place. This has been a project of mine for the past year.

It started at the end of December 2023 when we look to the new year, and think of all the things we would like to achieve. We are encouraged to look forward and think of God in our lives. I did the same.

I thought of the coming year, and what I might be able to achieve. I knew I would not be losing 5 stone or winning a Nobel peace prize so my mind turned to something which has a slightly deeper meaning in my life.

One aspect of Christian life I have always struggled with is quiet prayer. I have always struggled with the idea of having to sit and contemplate in silence, or even worse, speak my thoughts out loud. I have found over the many years that I also struggle with concentration. For those of you that know me this will not come as a surprise. After thinking on this for a while I concluded that this would be something I would work on in 2024.

The first challenge I faced was working out how to concentrate. This is not an easy thing to achieve when I spend so much of my time distracted. I thought to the times when I am most engaged. It's normally when I am doing something with my hands. If my hands are busy, I think better. I also like crafts. I endeavoured to find something which would combine all the things which would allow me to pray. I came to a conclusion to make prayer stars. It's something I have done in early church as a practical prayer activity. I thought it would be a way to do something small. To help with goal setting I decided to get a jar and look to fill it by the end of the year with my prayer stars. In January 2024 I started this process. I initially would sit for just a minute, write my prayer on the paper, and then fold it into a star. I found that in January I only did one a day. My jar was not looking very full but it did have some stars in it.

In February it increased slightly. I was finding that the act of sitting for a moment was not so arduous as at first, and instead was a simpler process. The jar slowly started to fill.

March was when I stopped writing on each star. I was starting to find that simply the act of sitting down to start was enough to clear my mind for prayer. By the end of March my jar was full.

As the year went on, I found that making the stars become just part of my day. I would sit quietly folding them and praying. It has been a moment of calm in my day. I lost count of the stars some time ago but each one is a prayer I have said in my time of quiet.

I am not sure if I will continue with the stars, but I will continue with my moment of quiet.

The end of 2024 has come and gone. I didn't lose 5 stone or win the Nobel peace prize, but my star jar was full and so were two large boxes. I thought to share this with you all in the hopes that it will make you stop and think for a moment about each prayer you say.
