## The 6 Ms

The London Institute for Contemporary Christianity have developed a framework to help us see how God is already working through us, and those we know, and to inspire our imaginations for how he might in the future.

It has six facets, and they all begin with M.

Ask yourself a simple question - 'which one of these am I good at?'

## Models godly character

Whatever we do, wherever we are, we are either reflecting God's character or we're not. So, with this M, we are reminding ourselves from the start that it is in our everyday that God forms our character to be like Jesus so that we can better reflect his character to those around us.

And as that happens, we become bearers of the fruit of the Holy Spirit: Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. This M is about these in action.

## Makes good work

Independent of anyone else, we can do everything – the fun, the interesting, the big, the small, the mundane, and the just plain boring – for the glory of God. To impact on people and the world he created and redeems, with joy, for it is the Lord Christ we are serving.

## Ministers grace and love

It could be as simple as a timely cup of coffee, or taking ten minutes out to talk stuff over with someone who is struggling.

#### Moulds culture

Culture can be thought of as 'the way we do things round here'. Moulding it means making small changes to dynamically express Christian values.

## Mouthpiece for truth and justice

Whether we realise it or not, this is something that we get to do every single day. It can be as simple as refusing to engage in gossip, or speaking up for someone who has been overlooked.

## Messenger of the gospel

This isn't about delivering a pre-packaged gospel warhead and retreating to a safe distance. Instead, it might be simply testifying to God's action in your life where it is appropriate to do so. It means having an intentionality, a desire to share something of Jesus with those around you and, when you can, to communicate the message of the gospel.

These 6Ms all work together. They are all a part of our witness to those around us of God's action in our lives. Hearing about a God of love becomes a lot more believable when you've seen the person who's sharing him with you act in a loving way. A God of justice makes sense when you've seen his follower stand up in the face of unfair practices.

## **Community Action Group**

The meeting of local church representatives with our MP Alex Mayer is now in the diary. This is part of the Constituency Action Network (CAN) initiative to address poverty. If you would like to join the group please contact Charles for details.

The Community Action Group are still working on ideas for an initiative that the whole church could get behind, that would allow Trinity to deliver a significant role in the broader community. We already donate, via various intermediaries, our small furniture, kitchen-ware, bedding and other items when they are no longer needed by us. Some of us make knitted and sewn items, others buy dry goods and toiletries for donation. Some donations are brought in by users of the premises who don't know where else to take them. Currently we are limited by lack of storage space.

We would like to provide an opportunity for people to drop in to see us during the week, apart from Tuesday Worship. If we were able to run a regular coffee morning in the same location, people could visit both to drop off donations and to pick up things they need but can't afford. And we could engage with them over a cup of coffee. It could be called our Recycling Hub - but would we be able to find the volunteers to make the coffee and oversee the donations and collections? Watch this space.

Lastly, we have heard via our circuit office about a Luton Foodbank campaign to get people to donate either an item of non-perishable food or £1 in cash for every day in Lent.

This has come to us a bit late in the day but on checking it appears that LL Helpers have a similar campaign this year. They are asking for 40p/day and they can be found at the Community Fridge in Waterborne Walk.
