From the manse...

As I prepared this piece, I found myself revisiting a reflection I had written during my previous sabbatical. Looking back, it's remarkable to see how much has happened in the seven years since then. Above all, we lived through the extraordinary experience of the Covid pandemic and all the changes it brought to our lives and ministry. And now, as I come to another sabbatical, I find myself reflecting more deeply on the words I first heard about sabbatical leave: "A sabbatical is not a holiday."

These three months starting in December, will be a time to look back over the past years and to prepare meaningfully for the next stage of ministry. Over the summer, I spent time in Korea, using the visit as a period of preparation. I also arranged to meet colleagues who once served in ministry here in the UK and have since returned to Korea, so that I may spend time with them and share God's word in their churches.

Another special blessing will be the opportunity to reunite with family members I have not seen in person for many years. In particular, my younger brother who lives in the United States, has been able to coordinate his visit so that we can all gather as a family for the first time in over twenty years—a truly meaningful occasion, even though we have kept in touch online.

During this sabbatical I also hope to make progress on completing my M.A. dissertation in its final year and to take time to discern the next steps for my ministry ahead. I am deeply grateful for this precious opportunity for rest and renewal. Please remember me in your prayers—that I may spend this time well, as planned, and as God leads, and also for our children (Solee, Soyun and Yunsang) who will be on their own while Grace and I are in South Korea.
